PRE CONGRESS WORKSHOPS - SUNDAY 31 OCTOBER 2010

Full Day Workshop (11h00 – 16h30)

1. Pelvic floor ultrasound

This workshop will be presented by Prof Peter Diedtz, Dr. Paul Swart and Dr. Zeelha Abdool. Prof Peter Diedtz is Professor in Obstetrics & Gynaecology at the Sydney Medical School, University of Sydney. He is active in a number of international scientific societies such as ASUM, RANZCOG, IUGA, ISUOG and ICS.

This full day workshop will familiarise attendees with the basic methodology and clinical uses of translabial/ perineal pelvic floor ultrasound imaging, both using 2D ultrasound and 3D/ 4D technology, including the detection and assessment of pelvic floor trauma. The first part of the workshop consists of lectures covering pelvic floor imaging of incontinence and prolapse as well as slings and meshes. The second part will consist of an ultrasound DVD training session.

Attendees must please bring their own laptop computer which is essential for this workshop.

2. Colposcopy Workshop

This workshop will be presented by Prof. David Allen and Prof Greta Dreyer. Prof Allen is from the Department O&G Melbourne Australia. Prof Greta Dreyer is head of the Gynaecologic Oncology Unit, Department Obstetrics & Gynaecology, University of Pretoria

Topics to be discussed at this workshop include:

- The transformation zone. The key to colposcopy
- Colposcopic technique and findings
- Choice of treatment. Don't miss the cancer
- Screening and colposcopy in the era of vaccination
- Question and answer session

3. Endoscopy Workshop

This workshop will be presented by Prof. Bash Goolab (WITS), Dr Abrie de Bruin (Pretoria), Dr. Igno Siebert (Stellenbosch University), Dr. Prashant Mangeshkar (Director Center for Gynecological Endoscopic Surgery, Mumbai India) , Dr. A.L Thurkow (Amsterdam)

This will be an interactive Video DVD session where the following topics will be addressed:

- Treatment of mild to moderate endometriosis
- Ovarian cystectomy
- Litigation in endoscopy
- Laparoscopic hysterectomy
- Training in Endoscopy: where and how much
- Laparoscopic myomectomy
- Operative hysteroscopy
- Hysteroscopic sterilization and operative hysteroscopy

4. CTG workshop

The CTG workshop will be presented by Prof. Gerry Visser from the Netherlands and Prof. Peter MeacDonald from the University of Pretoria. This will be in the format of an interactive session.

5. Obstetrics Workshop

The workshop with Prof Catherine Nelson-Piercy is an Obstetric Medicine workshop where obstetric medicine cases will be presented and discussed. 6. Obstetrics Ultrasound Workshop

The workshop is aimed at general Obstetricians and Gynecologists. During the workshop the 11 to 14 weeks scan as well as the 18 to 22 weeks anatomy scan and doppler ultrasound will be covered. Details of the different organ systems will be discussed and will be illustrated with video clips and images. Examples of the more common anomalies will also be given. There will be no hands on session. The presenters are Dr. Kate Billardo from Gronigen in The Netherlands and Dr. Hennie Lombaard from Steve Biko Academic Hospital in Pretoria.

7. MPS Safer Clinical Practice

Captain Trevor Dale, an ex-British Airways training captain, will present workshops on minimising human error in clinical practice. Hear from a well informed and engaging presenter how lessons learned on the flight deck can be adapted to the clinical environment.
